Extended activities related to the story

- Game: Picking out bananas
 - ➤ Show children a big bowl of fruit salad with cutouts/toys of fruit inside.
 - ➤ Invite children to take turns picking out bananas from the bowl within a 20-second time limit for each turn.
 - Guide the class to count the number of bananas picked out each round.
- Art-and-craft activity: Decorating the letter B
 - ➤ Give each child a pre-cut A-4 sized letter B.
 - Ask children to trace the letter B with their finger.
 - Give each child some small cutouts of bananas.
 - ➤ Guide children to paste the cutouts of bananas onto the letter B following the stroke order of forming the letter.



- Tell children that you want to make banana sandwiches with them.
- Invite Small Letter b to provide children with bananas and bread for making banana sandwiches.
- Invite children to make their own banana sandwich by guiding them to:
 - take one banana and a slice of bread.
 - peel the banana and slice the banana with a plastic knife.
 - put slices of banana on the bread.
 - ▶ fold the bread.
- Provide children with ample chances to listen to and say the names of the objects: banana, bread.
- Guide children to make association between the letter and the words (e.g., banana, bread, banana sandwich).
- Invite Small Letter b to eat banana sandwiches with children.

- Forming the letter B using counting bears
 - ▶ Give each child an A-4 sized big letter B template, with arrows showing the formation of the letter.
 - Give each child a basket of counting bears.
 - Guide children to form the letter B by putting the counting bears on the letter B according to the stroke order and the arrows shown on the template of the letter.
- Physical activity: Throwing balls
 - Label balls of different sizes with the letter 'B' or 'b', and label two baskets 'B' and 'b'.
 - ▶ Have children stand from a distance and throw the balls into the baskets with the matching letters.
 - ► Check the balls in the baskets with children.
- Singing a song
