Learning Activities:

Shared reading activity, art and craft activity

Learning Objectives:

> To understand and enjoy the story

> To develop preliminary reading strategies

> To understand the meaning of 'spider' and 'rat'

To say 'spider' and 'rat' when expressing their meaning

> To draw a rat or a spider during the extended activity

Resources:

Drawing paper, crayons, colour pencils, pencils

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Read aloud the title of the book and the author's name for children.
- Encourage children to describe the book cover: What can you see?
- Talk about the pets in the pet shop and ask children to make predictions about the story: What other pets are in the pet shop?
- Write or draw children's predictions on the board.

2 (1st Reading)

- Invite children to listen to the story.
- Track the text and read aloud the story to children.
- Talk about each page with the help of gestures, voices and facial expressions.
- Guide children to confirm their predictions.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud to P.2 to P.3. Talk about the illustrations on P.2 to P.3. Emphasise the word 'rat' and talk about a rat's features.
- Write the word 'rat' on the board.
- Invite some children to point at the word 'rat' in the text.
- Guide children to read aloud P.2 to P.3.

- Read aloud P.4 to P.5. Talk about the illustrations on P.4 to P.5. Emphasise the word 'spider' and talks about a spider's features.
- Write the word 'spider' on the board.
- Invite some children to point at the word 'spider' in the text.
- Guide children to read aloud P.4 to P.5.

4 (3rd Reading)

• Read aloud the book to children. Invite children to read aloud P.2 to P.5 with the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Art and craft activity: Drawing

- Show children how to draw a rat and a spider.
- Give each child a piece of drawing paper and invite each of the children to draw either a *rat* or a *spider*.
- Talk with children about their drawings: What is it?

Learning Objectives:

> To develop interest in reading

> To relate print to illustrations

To understand the meaning of 'goldfish' and 'snake'

To say 'goldfish' and 'snake' when expressing their meaning

> To read aloud the story title

Resources:

Drawing paper, crayons, colour pencils, pencils

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Guide children to read aloud the story title together and read aloud the author's name for children.
- Talk about the illustrations on the front cover.
- Recall children's memory of the story and discuss with children: *How many animals are presented to the family?*
- Write or draw children's answers on the board.

2 (1st Reading)

- Invite children to listen to the story.
- Track the text and read aloud the story to children.
- Talk about each page with the help of gestures, voices and facial expressions.
- Guide children to confirm their answers.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.6 to P.7. Talk about the illustrations on P.6 to P.7.
- Emphasise the word 'snake' and talk about a snake's features.
- Write the word 'snake' on the board.
- Invite some children to point at the word 'snake' in the text.
- Guide children to read aloud P.6 to P.7.

- Read aloud P.8 and describe the illustrations on P.8.
- Emphasise the word 'goldfish' and talk about a goldfish's features.
- Read and write the word 'goldfish' on the board.
- Invite some children to find the word 'goldfish' on P.8.
- Guide children to read aloud P.8.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story title and P.2 to P.8 with the teacher.
- Read aloud the rest of the book to children.

5 (Extended Activity)

Drama game: Still Image

- Explain and demonstrate to children how the game works.
- Ask children to pretend to be different animals and walk around in the classroom.
- Say 'Freeze!' and children need to stop moving.
- Tap on a child's shoulder to signal him/her to say 'I'm a ... (animal)'.

> To enjoy the story

> To relate daily experience to the story

> To understand the meaning of 'pet'

To say 'pet' when expressing their meaning

> To recognize the print of 'pet'

> To draw a *pet* for show-and-tell to be conducted later

on

Resources:

Drawing paper, crayons, colour pencils, pencils, toy pets

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Guide children to read aloud the story title and the author's name together.
- Invite children to talk about the book cover: What can you see?
- Invite discussion from children: What kind of pets do you like?

2 (1st Reading)

- Remind children to listen to the story.
- Read aloud the text with good intonation and facial expressions.
- Invite children to talk about some of the illustrations on some of the pages.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.1. Talk about the illustrations on P.1.
- Read aloud and write the word 'pet' on the board.
- Show children different toy pets.
- Invite children to find the word 'pet' on P.1.
- Guide children to read aloud P.1.

4 (3rd Reading)

• Invite children to read aloud the whole story with the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Art and craft activity: Drawing

- Show children how to draw different pets such as cats, dogs or hamsters.
- Talk to children while they are drawing: What is this?
- Guide children to say: My pet.

Learning Activities:

Show-and-tell

Learning Objectives:

> To listen to and speak in English in a meaningful

context

> To develop interest and confidence in using English

> To talk about one's favourite pets

> To learn the steps of doing show-and-tell

Resources:

Children's drawings, a special hat

What to do:

1 (Before Show-and-tell)

- Sing the show-and-tell song with children.
- Show children a special hat and introduce it to children: When you wear this hat, you will show and talk about your pet here.
- Put on the special hat.
- Show and talk about a drawing of a pet:

This is my pet.

It is a dog.

It is white.

It is big.

It can run very fast.

I love my dog.

• Ask children to clap hands to show appreciation.

2 (During Show-and-tell)

- Invite one child at a time to sit in front of the class.
- Help each child to put on the special hat.
- Ask each child the following questions:

What is it?

What colour is it?

What can it do?

What does it like to eat?

Do you love your pet?

3 (After Show-and-tell)

- Praise children for their sharing.
- Hand back the drawings to children.
