Learning Objectives:

> To understand and enjoy the story with the help of the illustrations

> To relate print to illustrations

To understand the meaning of big and small

> To say 'big' and 'small' when expressing

their meaning

Resources:

Whiteboard, two big boxes, big and small toys

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Show children the book.
- Identify and read aloud the title and the author's name for children.
- Talk about the illustrations on the front cover.
- Invite predictions from children: Which dog does Kipper like?
- Record children's answers on the whiteboard.

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression and help children understand and enjoy the story with the help of illustrations, gestures, facial expressions and pictures.
- Bring children's attention to the story by inviting predictions after reading P.14: *Will they bring this dog home?*
- Guide children to check and confirm their predictions on the whiteboard.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.8 to P.11.
- Talk about the illustrations from P.8 to P.11:
 Who wants this dog?
 Who does not want this dog? Why?
 Do you like this dog? Why?
- Show something of different sizes. Ask children which one is *big/small*.
- Guide children to read aloud the text from P.8 to P.11 with actions with the teacher.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story from the title and P.8 to P.11 after the teacher.
- Invite children to listen to the teacher reading aloud the rest of the book.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: Big and small

- Prepare toys of different sizes and put them into two boxes.
- Divide the class into two groups. Give each group a box. Each time let two children come out.
- When the teacher says 'I want something big', the two children will get one toy from the box.
- Guide children to compare the size of the toys and identify which one is *big/small*.

Learning Objectives:

> To understand and enjoy the story with the help of the illustrations

> To relate print to illustrations

> To understand the meaning of wants and strong

> To say 'wants' and 'strong' when expressing their meaning

Resources:

Whiteboard, toys, parachute

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Identify and read aloud the title and the author's name for children.
- Guide children to read aloud the title together. Read aloud the author's name for children.
- Show children pictures of the main characters and discuss with children:

Do you remember Kipper?

Which dog does he like?

How about Mum?

Which dog does she like?

- Think aloud to prompt answers from children.
- Record their answers on the whiteboard.

2 (1st Reading)

- Remind children to listen to the teacher reading the story.
- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression.
 Help children understand and enjoy the story with the help of illustrations, gestures, facial expressions and pictures.

• Guide children to check and confirm their answers on the whiteboard.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.12 to P.13
- Talk about the illustrations from P.12 to P.13:

Who wants this dog?
Who does not want this dog? Why?
Do you like this dog? Why?

- Show a heavy box. Lift the box and say 'I'm strong!'
- Guide children to read aloud the text from P.12 to P.13 with actions with the teacher.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story from the title and P.8 to P.13 after the teacher.
- Invite children to listen to the teacher reading aloud the rest of the book.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: We are strong!

- Let children hold a parachute.
- Put something on the parachute. Ask children to raise it while saying 'We are strong!'
- Repeat the game by putting in more and more items on the parachute.

Learning Objectives:

> To identify the title of the book

> To relate prior knowledge or daily

experience to the story

> To understand the meaning of dog

To say 'dog' when expressing their meaning

To recognise the *letter d* and say the sound /d/ in the words that begin with the *letter d*

> To read aloud the title, P.1 to P.3 and P.8 to

P.13 in the story

Resources:

Whiteboard, toy dog, cutouts of bones with

words

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Show children the book and ask one of them to point out the book title on the front cover.
- Invite other children to read aloud the title.
- Show children the picture of Biff and discuss with children:

Which dog does Biff like?

- Think aloud to prompt answers from children.
- Record their answers on the whiteboard.

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression and help children enjoy the story.
- Guide children to check and confirm their answers on the whiteboard.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.1 to P.3.
- Talk about the illustrations from P.1 to P.3. Who is reading the book? What is on the book cover? Everyone wants a dog. What kinds of dog do they like?

- Show some pictures and let children find out the dogs.
- Write the word 'dog' on the whiteboard.
- Bring children's attention to the beginning *letter d* in the word 'dog'.
- Write the *letter d* on the board and guide children to name the *letter d*.
- Introduce the letter sound /d/.
- Show some other words and ask children if they can find the *letter d* at the beginning.
- Guide children to say the letter sound /d/ in the words with beginning *letter d*.
- Guide children to read aloud the text from P.1 to P.3 with actions with the teacher.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story from the title, P. 1 to P.3 and P.8 to P.13 after the teacher.
- Invite children to listen to the teacher reading aloud the rest of the book.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: A big dog

- Show children a toy dog and tell children that the dog is hungry.
- Show children some cutouts of bones with words on them.
- Tell children that the *dog* just likes bones with words beginning with the *letter d*.
- Invite children to identify bones with words that begin with the *letter d* and feed the *dog*.
- Invite other children to verify if that is a right choice.
- Prompt children to say 'Yummy!' on behalf of the dog.

Learning Objectives:

> To identify the title of the book

To understand the meaning of happy and ...

wants this dog.

To say '... wants this dog.' when expressing its meaning

> To read aloud the whole story

> To sing the song Kipper Wants This Dog

Resources:

Whiteboard, song sheet

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Show children the book and ask one of them to point out and read aloud the book title on the front cover.
- Invite other children to read aloud the title.
- Identify and read aloud the author's name for children.
- Talk about the illustrations on the front cover and discuss with children:

Which dog do you like?
Do you have a dog? Is it big or small?

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the whole book with good intonation and expression and help children enjoy the story.
- Allow children to chime in if they want.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.8, P.10, P.12 and P.16
- Talk about the illustrations on P.8, P.10, P.12 and P.16: *Who wants this dog?*

What colour is the dog? Is the dog big or small? Do they like the dog?

• Guide children to read aloud P.8, P.10, P.12 and P.16 with actions with the teacher.

4 (3rd Reading)

• Invite children to read aloud the whole book with the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Singing: Kipper Wants This Dog

- Show the song sheet to children.
- Guide children to read aloud the lyrics.
- Sing the song to children once.
- Invite children to chime in singing the song.
