Text: *Sorry, I'm Busy!* (Big book story)

Learning Activities: Shared reading activity, real-life experience

activity

Learning Objectives:

➤ To understand and enjoy the story with the help of the illustrations

> To relate print to illustrations

To understand the meaning of 'Chinese New Year' and 'cleaning the house'

To say 'Chinese New Year' and 'cleaning the house' when expressing their meaning

Resources: Whiteboard, towels, a bucket of water

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Identify and read aloud the title and the author's name on the front cover for children.
- Talk about the illustrations on the front cover.
- Invite predictions from children: *Who will clean the house?*
- Jot down children's answers on the whiteboard.

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression. Help children understand and enjoy the story with the help of illustrations, gestures and facial expressions.
- Bring children's attention to the twists and turns by inviting predictions after reading P.15: What will Mum say?
- Guide children to check and confirm their predictions on the board.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.2.
- Talk about the illustrations on P.2, e.g., things inside the house.
- Read and write 'Chinese New Year' on the board and guide children to find the words in the book.
- Read aloud P.3.
- Talk about the illustrations on P.3, e.g., things on the floor.
- Show a towel. Use the towel to clean something, e.g., a board, a table or a chair. Say 'I'm cleaning the ...'
- Guide children to read aloud P.2 and P.3.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story from the title to P.3 after the teacher.
- Invite children to listen to the teacher reading aloud the rest of the book.

5 (Extended Activity)

Real-life experience activity: Clean up the classroom

- Give some towels and a bucket of water to children.
- Invite children to clean up the classroom by saying: Chinese New Year is coming. Can you help me to clean up the classroom?
- When children are cleaning the classroom, invite children to say 'I'm cleaning the ...'

Learning Activities: Shared reading activity, game

Learning Objectives:

> To understand and enjoy the story with the help of the illustrations

> To understand the meaning of 'clean the windows', 'put these up', 'fill the candy box' and 'water the flowers'

To say 'clean the windows', 'put these up', 'fill the candy box' and 'water the flowers' when expressing their meaning

Resources: Whiteboard, pictures of windows and towels,

Fai Chun, candy box, candy, flowers

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Show the book and identify the title and the author on the front cover and the inner page.
- Guide children to read aloud the title together. Read aloud the author's name for children.
- Discuss with children: What did Mum do when she cleaned up the house?
- Jot down children's answers on the whiteboard.

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression. Help children understand and enjoy the story with the help of illustrations, gestures and facial expressions.
- Allow children to chime in if they want.
- Guide children to check and confirm their answers on the board.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.4 to P.5.
- Point at the words 'clean the windows' and read them aloud.
- Point to the picture, show the props (pictures of windows and towels) and demonstrate the action to help children understand the meaning of 'clean the windows'.
- Invite several children to *clean the windows* with the teacher.
- Guide children to read aloud P.4 to P.5.
- Use the same method to help children learn 'put these up', 'fill the candy box' and 'water the flowers' on P.6 to P.11.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story from the title to P.11 after the teacher.
- Invite children to listen to the teacher reading aloud the rest of the book.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: Teacher says

- Invite children to do the actions of cleaning the windows, putting Fai Chun up, filling the candy box and watering the flowers.
- When the teacher says 'Teacher says ...', children do the action together. When teacher says 'Monster says ...', children should not do the action and need to make a cross with their hands or arms.

Learning Objectives:

> To read aloud the whole book with good intonation and expression

> To understand the meaning of 'Can we have dinner, please?' and 'Sorry, I'm busy.'

> To ask 'Can we have dinner, please?' and say 'Sorry, I'm busy.' when expressing their

meaning

Resources:

Whiteboard, headbands, pictures of windows

and towels, Fai Chun, candy box, candy,

flowers, newspaper, knitting needles, telephone

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Show the book. Invite children to read aloud the title and the author's name.
- Discuss with children: What did you do at Chinese New Year?
- Guide children to share their experience and respond to their answers.

2 (1st Reading)

- Read aloud the whole book with good intonation.
- Allow children to chime in if they want.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.12 to P.16.
- Point at the sentences 'Can we have dinner, please?' and 'Sorry, I'm busy' and read them aloud.

- Use gestures and illustrations to help children understand the meaning of 'Can we have dinner, please?' and 'Sorry, I'm busy'.
- Guide children to read aloud P.12 to P.16.

4 (3rd Reading)

• Invite children to read aloud the whole book with good intonation and expression with the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Role-play

- Show the headband of each character in the story.
- Invite children to be the Mum, Dad, Big Brother, Big Sister and Grandma in the role play.
- Refer to the big storybook as a guide to the role play.
- Guide children to role-play the story.
- Repeat the role play to allow all children's participation.
