Session: 1 of 4

Text: Happy Easter (Big book story)
Learning Activities: Shared reading activity, game

Learning Objectives:

> To understand and enjoy the story

> To develop preliminary reading strategies

> To understand the meaning of 'Easter' and 'Easter eggs'

To say 'Easter' and 'Easter eggs' when expressing their meaning

To recognise the print of 'Easter' and 'Easter eggs' when seeing the print

Resources: Calendar, pictures of Easter eggs, magic bag, Easter eggs

and other eggs

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Read aloud the title of the book and the author's name for children.
- Show a calendar and pictures of *Easter* to help children understand that Easter is coming.
- Encourage children to describe the book cover by asking: What can you see?
- Talk about the boy and ask children to make predictions about the story: *The boy is looking for something. What is he looking for?*
- Write or draw children's predictions on the board.

2 (1st Reading)

- Invite children to listen to the story.
- Track the text and read aloud the story to children.
- Talk about each page with the help of gestures, voices and facial expressions.
- Invite children to make predictions about the story after reading P.3, P.5 and P.7. Ask children: Where is the egg?
- Refer children to the board and check the predictions with children.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.2. Talk about the illustrations on P.2 and point at the word 'Easter'. Show pictures of Easter and talk about Easter chicks and Easter bunnies.
- Write the word 'Easter' on the board.
- Invite some children to point at the word 'Easter' in the text.
- Guide children to read aloud P.2.
- Read aloud P. 11. Talk about the illustrations on P.11 and point at the words 'Easter eggs'. Draw eggs from the magic bag and invite children to say 'Easter eggs' together if an Easter egg is drawn.
- Write the words 'Easter eggs' on the board.
- Invite some children to find the words 'Easter eggs' in the text.
- Guide children to read aloud P.11.

4 (3rd Reading)

• Read aloud the story to children. Invite children to read aloud P.2 and P.11 after the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: How many Easter eggs are there?

- Show a bag of *Easter eggs* and divide children into two groups.
- Invite children to touch the magic bag and guess the number of *Easter* eggs in the bag.
- Invite children to check the answer by counting together: One *Easter egg*, two *Easter eggs*, three *Easter eggs* ...
- Award one point to the group if the answer is correct.

Learning Activities:

Shared reading activity, game

Learning Objectives:

To develop interest in readingTo relate print to illustrations

To understand the meaning of 'grass', 'rocks', 'go through' and 'go around' when hearing them

> To say 'grass', 'rocks', 'go through' and 'go around'

when expressing their meaning

Resources: Hula hoops, Easter chicks and bunnies

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Read aloud the title of the book and the author's name for children.
- Invite children to talk about the illustrations on the front cover by asking: *What can you see?*
- Recall children's memory of the story and discuss with children: Where did the children find the Easter eggs?
- Write or draw children's answers on the board.

2 (1st Reading)

- Invite children to listen to the story.
- Track the text and read aloud the story to children.
- Talk about each page with the help of gestures, voices and facial expressions.
- After reading P.3, P.5 and P.7, ask children: Where can they find more eggs?
- Refer children to the answers on the board and check the answers with children.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.4. Talk about the illustrations on P.4.
- Point at the word 'grass'. Talk about the colour of grass and the insects on the grass on P.4.

- Show other pictures of grass and talk about them.
- Talk about the illustrations on P.4 again. Point at the phrase 'go through' when talking about how the boy gets the Easter eggs behind the grass.
- Show the action of 'go through'. Invite children to say 'go through' and do the action together.
- Demonstrate how to go through a hoop. Invite a child to go through the hoop and invite other children to say 'go through' together.
- Guide children to read aloud P.4.
- Read aloud P.6. Talk about the illustrations on P.6.
- Point at the word 'rocks' and talk about the sizes of rocks.
- Talk about the illustrations on P.6 again. Point at the phrase 'go around' when talking about how the boy finds more Easter eggs.
- Show the action of 'go around'. Invite children to say 'go around' and do the action together.
- Demonstrate how to *go around* a hoop. Invite a child to *go around* the hoop and invite other children to say 'go around' together.
- Guide children to read aloud P.6.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the title, P.2 to P.7 and P.11 after the teacher.
- Read aloud the rest of the book to children.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: Listen and do

- Divide children into groups of 5 to 6 and guide them to line up.
- Put 2 to 3 hoops in front of each group.
- Assign the first child of each group to be the representative and stand at the opposite side of the hoops, facing the rest of the group.
- Guide the second child of each group to stand in front of their group members and show a picture card of 'go through/around' to the group members.
- Invite the whole group to give instructions to the representative by saying 'go through/around' according to the card.
- Guide the representative to *go through* or *go around* the hoops according to the command. The fastest one can get one point.
- Repeat a few times with different children as the representatives.

Text:

Learning Objectives:

> To enjoy listening to the story

> To develop interest and confidence in reading

> To understand the meaning of 'basket', 'look in' and 'look under'

To say 'basket', 'look in' and 'look under' when expressing their meaning

> To have an experience of an Easter egg hunt

Resources:

Basket, materials for Easter egg hunt, Easter eggs

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Identify and read aloud the title on the front cover for children.
- Invite children to talk about the book cover by asking: What can you see?
- Recall children's memory of the story.
- Invite discussion from children: How many Easter eggs did the children find?
- Write or draw children's answers on the board.

2 (1st Reading)

- Remind children to listen to the story.
- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression.
- Invite children to talk about some of the illustrations on some of the pages.
- Refer children to the answers on the board and check the answers with children.

3 (2nd Reading)

• Read aloud P.8. Talk about the illustrations on P.8. Point at the phrase 'look under' when talking about how the children find the Easter eggs.

- Put a pencil under the chair. Pretend finding the pencil. Demonstrate the action of 'look under'.
- Guide children to read aloud P.8.
- Read aloud P.9. Talk about the illustrations on P.9. Point at the word 'basket'.
- Show pictures/realia of a *basket* and talk about the things in the *basket*.
- Talk about the illustrations on P.9 again. Point at the phrase 'look in' when talking about the number of Easter eggs in the basket.
- Turn to P.10 and invite children to count the Easter eggs in the basket.
- Show a box and invite children to find out what things are in the box by saying 'Let's look in the box and find out'.
- Guide children to read aloud P.9.

4 (3rd Reading)

- Invite children to read aloud the story title and P.2 to P.11 with the teacher.
- Read aloud the rest of the book to children.

5 (Extended Activity)

Game: Easter egg hunt

- Introduce the objects in the classroom (e.g., school bag, chair, basket).
- Demonstrate how to give instructions to others to find the Easter eggs by using 'Look in the (basket)./Look under the (table).'
- Divide children into groups of 6 or 8. Group children in pairs in each group.
- Assign each pair of children to be a seeker and a commander.
- Guide the commanders to stay in the 'Restricted Area' to give instructions.
- Guide the seekers to find the Easter eggs according to the commander's instructions.
- The group which finds the most eggs will be the winners.

Shared reading activity, singing

Learning Objectives:

> To develop interest and confidence in using English

> To understand the meaning of 'Let's' and 'share' when hearing them

> To say 'Let's' and 'share' when expressing their meaning

Resources:

Song sheet, plastic eggs with chocolate eggs inside

What to do:

1 (Presenting the Text)

- Guide children to identify and read aloud the title on the front cover.
- Invite children to talk about the book cover: What can you see?
- Recall children's memory of the story.
- Discuss with children: When will Easter holidays begin? What will you do?

2 (1st Reading)

- Invite children to listen to the story.
- Read aloud the text with good intonation and expression.
- Invite children to talk about some of the illustrations on some of the pages.

3 (2nd Reading)

- Read aloud P.11. Talk about the illustrations on P.11. Point at the word 'share' when talking about how the children share the Easter eggs with others.
- Give some candies to a child and invite him/her to share with others.
- Guide children to read aloud P.11. Bring children's attention to the word 'Let's'. Help children understand when to use the word 'Let's' with the illustrations.
- Guide children to invite other friends to do some actions together by saying 'Let's ...'

4 (3rd Reading)

• Invite children to read aloud the whole book with the teacher.

5 (Extended Activity)

Singing: *Happy Easter*

- Track and read aloud the lyrics to children.
- Guide children to read aloud the lyrics after the teacher.
- Sing the song once.
- Invite children to sing the song with the teacher.
- Sing the song again with gestures.
- Give out plastic eggs to children.
- Ask children to open the plastic eggs and get the chocolate eggs in the plastic eggs.
- Guide the children who have more than one chocolate egg to *share* with the ones who do not have any by saying 'Let's share.'
- Sing the song again and enjoy the Easter eggs together.
